

Stats – BLS 2016

- 2083 U.S. workers died (40% of all deaths).
- 587 deaths were non-roadway crashes involving motor vehicles and pedestrians struck by motor vehicles.
- Construction & Extraction (222) 2nd to Transportation (>900)
- Vehicles involved in fatal crashes
 - Semi, tractor-trailer, and tanker trucks (39%)
 - Pick-up trucks and SUVs together (21%)
 - Passenger vehicles (20%)

Pre Trip – Do you need to drive?

- Journey Mgmt
 - Assess driving risk exposures associated with a company's unique operations
 - Vehicles, passengers
 - Distance, road conditions
 - Time of day
 - Weather
 - Communications
 - Hours on duty (last 24)

Pre Trip Safety Check


- Inspections

Pre Trip – Safety Items

- First aid kit
- Fire extinguisher
- Safety Data Sheets
- Emergency roadside kit
 - Hi-vis Class 3
 - Alerting technique
 - Food/water
 - Lights


