








Horizontal Well Permits Issued by Year






Total Natural Gas Production v. Consumption








Shale Oil Production by Quarter







Shale Natural Gas Production by Quarter

















Real Estate Property Taxes Paidfor Oil & Gas Wells(2010-2015)



Real Estate Tax from Wells is 24% of Total Property Tax




Real Estate Property Tax from Wells as a % of Total Property Tax


